I would also like to thank our Principal Father Vincent Nazareth who encouraged and motivated us to win each and every match. We are highly thankful to God for letting you as our Principal.



Finally, 'Micfest 2004' held at Mahanagar Boys was an euphoria for all the Pranciscans.





## Discipline


Discipline is the soul of any school or organisation. No school or organisation can be successful till it has a sense of discipline in it. It is the very basic need of social life.

## Tsunami

What is Tsunami?

Tsunami comes from Japanese word for 'harbour wave'. Generally called tidal waves, though the phrase is a misnomer as it has nothing to do with tides. Tsunamis are generated when ocean floor shifts vertically, usually due to an earthquake.

When a shift in the ocean floor displaces the water above, the body of water travels as a huge wave to regain equilibrium.

In deep water a tsunami can travel at 700 km/hr. But in shallow water near coast, it gets slower, and water mass rises up to 50m.

A tsunami can strip coats of sand, uproot trees, wipe out towns. Travelling hundreds of metres inland, it can flood coastal towns.



And so the debate continues as if being studious was a sin!




Nov. 6




Nov. 29 Half yearly examinations commence. Class XII students are spared as they slog it out in extra classes while the others have a nerve wracking fortnight.














- Republic Day is celebrated with our principal at the helm of affairs. After a short Jan. 26 programme and flag hoisting, students are allowed to go home.



जल मानव सिंहत सभी जीवधारियों के लिए प्रकृति प्रदत्त ऐसी वस्तु है जिसका कोई विकल्प नहीं है। जीवधारियों एवं वनस्पतियों को जीवित रहने तथा उनका विकास करने में प्रतिदिन ४ से ५ लीटर जल किसी न किसी रूप में पहुँचना चाहिए। कम मात्रा में जल पीने या किसी कारण जैसे रक्तस्त्राव, उल्टियों या दस्त होने से पानी के शरीर से निकल जाने पर शरीर में जल की कमी (डी– हाइड्रोजन)हो जाती हैं, इससे शरीर में रक्त की मात्रा कम हो जाती है क्योंकि रक्त में एक बड़ा भाग (90%) पानी ही होता है।

इस शस्यश्यामला मूमि पर मंडराते जिन खतरों को लेकर चिंता व्यक्त की जा रही है उनमें 'घटता जलस्तर' भी एक ज्वलन्त मुद्दा है। इस घटते जलस्तर का मुख्य कारण अप्राकृतिक और अवैज्ञानिक रूप से जल-दोहन है। दुर्भाग्यवश पिछले कुछ दशकों में पर्यावरण असन्तुलन से जल को लेकर समस्याएँ बढ़ी हैं जैसे भूगर्भ या निदयों का घटता जलस्तर, अन्य जल स्त्रोतों का सूखना, विषैले जल से मनुष्यों के साथ-साथ जीव जन्तुओं और वनस्पतियों को भी हानि हो रही है। जरा सोचिए यदि ऐसी स्थित रही तो 'मंगल ग्रह पर जीवन' का सपना देख रहे मनुष्य का धरती पर जीवन कैसा होगा?

भूमिगत जलस्तर घटने के अनेक कारण हैं। प्राचीन समय से ही तालाब आदि जल स्त्रोत हमारे यहाँ सिंचाई के परम्परागत साधन रहे हैं लेकिन आज मनुष्य इन तालाबों को पाटकर सपनों का महल खड़ा कर रहा है। फलस्वरूप सिंचाई के लिए ट्यूबवेलों के जिए जलदोहन हो रहा है। अत्यधिक पेड़ों के कटने से वन क्षेत्र सिकुड़ते गए, नतीजतन, वर्षाजल घटता गया। अन्य स्त्रोतों से मिलने वाला जल दूषित हो रहा है अतः स्वच्छ जल की प्राप्ति हेतु धड़ाधड़ वाटरपम्पों को निर्माण हो रहा है। यदि इन कारणों पर नियन्त्रण नहीं किया गया तो हरी भरी भूमि बंजर हो जाएगी और उस पर मानव का अस्तित्व सम्भव नहीं रहेगा।


#### जल संरक्षण की आवश्यकता


संयुक्त राष्ट्र संघ द्वारा हाल ही में प्रकाशित आंकड़ों के अनुसार विश्व के विकासशील देशों के लगभग १२ करोड़ व्यक्तियों को स्वच्छ तथा पीने योग्य जल उपलब्ध नहीं है एवम् विकासशील देशों में प्रतिवर्ष २ करोड़ ५० लाख लोगों की मौत दूषित जल से सम्बन्धित बीमारियों के कारण हो जाती है। इस समस्या के निवारण के लिए हमें वर्षा के जल का संचयन और जल संरक्षण करना ही होगा।

## वर्षाजल संचयन एवम् जलसंरक्षण के उपाय-

- (9) रेन सेन्टर की स्थापना वर्षाजल संचयन और जल संरक्षण की तकनीक, लागत तथा इसकी विशेषज्ञ जानकारी एक ही स्थान पर उपलब्ध कराने तथा इसे लागू करने के लिए तकनीकी सहायता उपलब्ध कराने की व्यवस्था सुनिश्चित कराने के लिए रेन सेन्टर की स्थापना की जानी चाहिए।
- (२) जन जागृति जल का उचित उपयोग सुनिश्चित करने हेतु जनजागरण अभियान चलाया जाना चाहिए तथा जल संरक्षण की भावना विकसित करने हेतु शिक्षा, कानून, पुरस्कार तथा दण्ड की व्यवस्था की जानी चाहिए।
- (३) अन्य उपाय -
  - (अ) विद्यालय या महाविद्यालय स्तर पर छात्र छात्राओं को वाटर हार्वेस्टिंग की आवश्यकता या सम्बन्धित तकनीकी ज्ञान दिया जाना चाहिए।







- (व) प्रशासनिक स्तर पर बहुमंजिला इमारतों के नक्शे तमी पास किए जाये जब उसमें 'वर्षाजल संचयन प्रणाली' हो।
- (स) अधिक से अधिक वृक्षारोपण किया जाए क्योंकि वृक्षों की जड़ों के माध्यम से ही जल वापस घरती में पहुँचता है।
- (द) बाढ़ वाले क्षेत्रों में अतिरिक्त पानी को एकत्रित कर ग्रीष्म फसलों में प्रयोग किया जाए।
- (प) वर्षाऋतु से पूर्व खेतों में मेड़बन्दी की जानी चाहिए ताकि जल खेत में ही रहे।
- (फ) दैनिक जीवन में जल का प्रयोग करते समय छोटी-छोटी बातों का ध्यान रखकर जल संरक्षण में योगदान दे सकते हैं जैसे फलों या सब्जी को धोने के बाद इस जल को फेंकने के बजाय क्यारी में डाल सकते है। पाइप के द्वारा पानी इस्तेमाल करे, इससे कम पानी बर्बाद होगा, मंजन करते वक्त तथा शेविंग करते वक्त नल को आवश्यकता पड़ने पर ही खोलें, नहाते वक्त शावर की जगह बाल्टी और लोटें का प्रयोग करे। टूटे नलों की तुरन्त मरम्मत करायें।

इस प्रकार कई छोटी छोटी बातों का ध्यान रखकर इस दिशा में अपना योगदान दे सकते हैं। वास्तव में यदि पृथ्वी पर उपलब्ध जल की मात्रा देखें तो पानी की कमी भी नहीं है, ना ही अधिकता बस आवश्यकता है कि जल चक्र नियन्त्रित किया जाये और यह दृढ़ इच्छा शक्ति, संसाधनों के उचित इस्तेमाल, योजनाओं के सही क्रियान्वयन व्यवस्थित जल प्रबृद्धन तथा स्वयं जागरूक होकर ही सम्भव है।


## प्रेरक विचार
