The Taint of Arrogance

Arrogance is a two-edged sword. While it can make people feel superior and confident when stating their beliefs or points in an argument, the people receiving the message are often offended by the arrogance and feelings of superiority emanating from the messenger. In other words, the message may be valid, insightful, and credible, but these qualities are tainted and spoiled by the arrogant way it is delivered. There are a sundry of contexts where this happens, but I want to focus on one particular, controversial topic, and that is worldviews. Narrowing the subject even more, I will focus on fundamentalist Christians and hardcore atheists, who are science fundamentalists.

These two viewpoints provoke venomous responses from both sides of the argument. It is obvious that resentment easily morphs into disdain and outright hatred for the opposing point-of-view. When this happens, any hope of conversion or convincing others to see things from either viewpoint is overshadowed by the venomous nature of the argument. Stated another way, the message is tainted beyond recognition by the arrogant attitudes of the messengers.



Christian fundamentalists use faith rooted in the Bible, which is proclaimed as the infallible, literal "Word of God." Most of the time, they view atheists as evil opponents who desecrate the Christian faith if only through a lack of belief in a higher power. I have heard more than one Christian say they hate atheists. They also see atheists as a threat to their evangelical pursuits. Itis not difficult to see that Christian fundamentalists dismiss atheists as spiritually ignorant because they do not believe in God. I have watched more than one Christian cringe and become angry when the word "atheist" is spoken aloud.

Hardcore atheists (hereby referred to as "science fundamentalists") react in a very similar manner when the word "Christian" is spoken. Science fundamentalists rely on logic, reason, and scientific evidence to prove there is no God, and they can be just as arrogant and condescending toward Christians or anyone who dares dispute scientific claims. Have they forgotten that science—not pseudo science that tries to pass for real science, but true science that uses the scientific method to test hypothesis—does not claim to "prove" anything? Scientific research develops a hypothesis. Once the hypothesis is formed, research is designed and conducted; then it is determined whether the data "supports" the validity of the hypothesis. In other words, science always leaves room for further research when more information is revealed.

So, dear science fundamentalist, when you "beat Christians over the head with scientific evidence," you are not using irrefutable facts. You are using what is supported by current research and accepted as fact, but new information might prove the current research invalid. True science always leaves room for new discoveries or knowledge that will void what is supported by current scientific research. Likewise, dear Christian fundamentalist, when you beat Atheists over the head with a Bible," you are assuming they accept your dogma and literal translation of the Bible. Do not both of you realize that arrogant attacks, which vilify and demean each other, do very little to convince others of your superiority? Love and acceptance, whether you agree or not, will get you closer to your goal.

Why can't the people on both sides of this issue lighten-up on each other and recognize the following: We are all creatures stuck on a rock with a molten centre hurdling through space. We do not fully understand how we got here, what we are supposed to do while we are here, nor do we know when we are going to leave and what happens when we leave.

I can see validity and credibility in both perspectives, but nasty attacks that vilify those who do not agree with you do not promote your respective messages effectively. In other words, arrogance taints your messages, and your credibility is damaged. Most importantly, those of us in the middle of the melee grow weary of dodging barbs and being sucked into your arrogance. A quote from the late Earnest Hemingway is an appropriate end to this discussion: "There is nothing noble in being superior to your fellow man; true nobility is being superior to your former self."

St. Francis' College Students visit a 'National Research Laboratory' in the City

On August 01, 2012, a group of 45 students studying biology at St. Francis' College visited Indian Institute of Toxicology Research, a premier institute under the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research, Government of India. The Students were accompanied by Mr. Mathews, their biology teacher. The visit was basically designed to provide exposure to students who are keen to take science and particularly biological research as their future career. Accordingly, they were briefed about various facets of biological research such as toxicology, clinical research, biotechnology & microbiology, cell biology, genetically modified crops, analytical chemistry and electron microscopy. Besides these, the application of modern techniques such as stem cell research, cloning, use of sophisticated instruments like gas and mass spectrometry were explained to them by expert scientists working in their respective fields.

In the beginning, Dr. K.C. Gupta, Director, ITTR outlined the importance of research as a whole for the development of our country. Scientists from the above field also addressed the students to motivate them to opt for research as one of their future career. Later, the students visited 5 different laboratories of the institute to observe what and how a particular research is being pursued. The students also viewed a film describing the R & D activities of ITTR. The students showed high enthusiasm to learn about the research and interacted with many of our scientists and asked curious questions.

This activity was initiated by M. Sameer, Class XII-B with the help of Sir R. Mathews at St. Francis' College and coordinated by Dr. Manickam and Mr. Baskar Bhattacharji of IITR.

Political Corruption - The Hidden Demon

Political corruption is the use of power by government officials for illegitimate private gain. Misuse of government power for other purposes, such as repression of political opponents and general police brutality, is not considered political corruption. Neither are illegal acts by private persons or corporations not directly involved with the government. An illegal act by an office holder constitutes political corruption only if the act is directly related to their official duties, is done under color of law or involves trading in influence.



Forms of corruption vary but include bribery, extortion, cronyism, nepotism, patronage, graft and embezzlement. Corruption may facilitate criminal enterprise such as drug trafficking, money laundering and human trafficking though is not restricted to these activities.

The activities that constitute illegal corruption differ depending on the country or jurisdiction. For instance, some political funding practices that are legal in one place many be illegal in another. In some cases, government officials have broad or ill-defined powers, which make it difficult to distinguish between legal and illegal actions. Worldwide, bribery alone is estimated to involve over 1 trillion US dollars. A state of unrestrained political corruption is known as a kleptocracy, literally meaning "rule by thieves".



Corruption in India is a major issue and adversely affects economy. A 2009 study conducted by Transparency International in India found that more than 62% of Indians had first hand experience of paying bribes or influence peddling to get false jobs done in public offices successfully. In 2012 India has ranked 94th out of 176 countries in Transparency International Corruption Perceptions Index. Most of the largest sources of corruption in India are

entitlement programs and social spending schemes enacted by the Indian government. Examples include Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act and National Rural Health Mission. Other daily sources of corruption include India's Trucking industry which is forced to pay billions in bribes annually to numerous regulatory and police stops on its interstate highways. Indian media has widely published allegations of corrupt Indian citizens stashing trillions of dollars in Swiss banks. Swiss authorities, however assert these allegations to be a complete fabrication and false.

It is argued that the following conditions are favourable for corruption: Information deficits, lacking freedom of information legislation, lack of investigatives reporting in the local media, contempt for or negligence of exercising freedom of speech and freedom of the press, weak accounting practices, including timely financial management, lack of corruption, lacking control of the government, lacking civic society and non-governmental organizations which monitor the government, weak Civil Service and slow pace of reform, weak rule law, weak legal profession, weak judicial independence, large unsupervised public investments and many more reasons.

Corruption is a major problem and can only be removed when each and every citizen of India fights it because it is rightly said:

"United we stand, divided we Fall."




Types of Government

Jill Bolte Taylor is a brain scientist at the neuropsychiatry department of Harvard University. She learnt her first lesson in true brain function when, at the age of 38, she came down with an intense headache one morning. The pain was so unbearable and soon made her lose all her left brain functions like speech, comprehension, use of the right half of the body and self consciousness. But what she discovered that morning was so profound which no one could

ever have found, which the world needs to know. Jill had the unique opportunity to learn the brain functions inside out. She was acutely aware of the two distinct brain parts, the right and the left connected only by millions of axons through the corpus callosum.

The right brain is a parallel processor, while the left brain is a serial processor, if you like. While the left brain thinks linearly, the right thinks holistically. The left brain understands the present, past and the future, the reason why we all feel miserable. The right brain, on the contrary, connects us with this whole universe as a speck in the omnipotent universal consciousness. That morning, Jill felt real "nirvana" in her own words. However, now and then her dying left brain would kick her back to the mad world, reminding her "Hey Jill, you have a problem, you need help!" Soon she will fall into that blissful satchitananda of the disconnected right brain that connects her only to her maker, the universal consciousness

Doctors at the Mass General Hospital removed a large blood clot in her left brain caused by a vessel bursting open. It took her eight years to get back her normal functions, to go back to work again on the human brain. She goes round the world telling people how she felt that fateful morning which transformed her whole life and gave her a new perspective. She has learnt to forget those two most dangerous days of the year -yesterday and tomorrow. God presented her with a present - "today" to enjoy.

Yesterday has been a dream and no force on earth can undo that : tomorrow is only a mirage which no one could predict. Why then worry about those two days and make life miserable? One could live blissfully in the present trying to help others live



well too. Happiness comes in search of you when you help make another person happy. Thena thyakthena bhoonjithaaha – "rejoice in giving" is the adivice of the Ishopasnishad.

One need not get brain haemorrhage to realize God. We could do that by stimulating our right brain functions through praanaayaama regularly. David Schanoff Khasla, a neuro-psychiatrist in San Diego University, had been working on the benefits of left nostril breathing (Krtya Yoga) in treating mental ailments such as depression, epilepsy, obsessive compulsive neurosis and other anxiety disorders. Human mind is intangible but is a wonderful wonder. Mind is not an organ in the conventional sense; it is not situated in the brain or any other organ. Brain is a computer coordinating all the body functions. Mind is only energy at the subatomic level of every single human cell of which there are one hundered thousand billions in all.

Matter and energy are the two sides of the same coin; they are not two distinct entities at the subtlest level, opines a great physicist, Hans-Peter Duen; Emeritus President of the Max Planck Institute in Munich, who succeeded Albert Einstien and Werner Heisenberg. Trying to look at its subtlest level for the last 55 years, Hans-Peter recently realized that there is no matter distinct from energy at that level. That vast omnipotent energy is the universal consciousness (or God) and we humans are but a tiny bit of that consciousness, the individual consciousness.

One need not go in search of God in all temples, churches and mosques, while our own God resides within all of us as universal compassion and friendship. Why not try and develop that God who is attainable to each and everyone of us? One need not even be literate to do that, one has to be educated though, to know that God resides inside each of us. We need to transform ourselves from the manliness of "getting and forgetting to the godsliness of giving and forgiving" One could attain godhood easily by meditation and praeneayaemee not overnight but by constant practice.

Batman - The Knight of Gotham

'Batman' is a fictional superhero character created by Bob Kane and Bill Pringer who fights against the crime in a fictional city known as Gotham city and is regarded as one of the work's greatest detectives. Batman first appeared in Detective comics #27 in May 1939. But since the superhero got popular, so got its own separate title in 1940. Batman is also known as 'The Park Knight', 'The Caped Crusader' or 'The Masked Vigilante'. He has got no super powers like other superheroes but relies on his knowledge, mortal power and science for defeating his enemies.

Batman, as featured in graphic novels, movies etc. is originally an eccentric billionaire Bruce Wayne who is the owner of 'Wayne Enterprises', his father's company. He takes the identity of the 'Batman' to protect the city from crime by the night. As a young boy, Bruce fell into a well where he was attacked by a swarm of bats after which he developed a phobia against them. Few days later, his parents were murdered by a mugger named Joe Chill with a sole purpose to rob them.



Young Bruce was then fostered by their family butler Alfred J. Pennyworth. Soon after growing up he left Gotham and travelled around the world to conquer the criminal minds and to find out why his parents were murdered. During his expedition, he received training in martial arts from people like Master Kingi from Korea, Henry Ducard from France and Willie Doggelt who improved his detective skills. After he returned to Gotham, he rightfully inherited Wayne Enterprises. He realised that real power comes from fear. He adopted the identity of Batman so that his enemies may share his dread. Along with the help of his butler Alfred and Wayne Enterprises' top scientist Lucius

Fox, he became the Batman to protect his city from crime by the night which devoured his parents.

Bruce dresses up in a custom apparel, popularly known as the 'Batsuit'. It consists of an armour made up of Kevlar and nomex which protects Bruce from knives and gunfire. He wears a cape and a mask like a bat to terrorize his enemies. But Batman alone is insignificant without his most trusted allies. Alfred, his family butler is one of his most important associates. His ability ranges from cooking to field medicine which makes his Bruce Wayne's most eminent helper. Lucius Fox also provides Bruce with the latest technology including his armour, "BATMOBILE" his vehicle and several others arms and weapons. James W. arresting the criminals. Harvey Dent, Gotham City's district attorney, also aids him in legitimately penalizing the criminals. Harvey later becomes Batman's one of the most bitter enemies, and takes the alias of two-face because a criminal once threw acid over his face which scarred half of his face. As an accomplice, Tim Drake, a college student, helps Batman to combat against the crime in Gotham after adopting the identity of Robin. Batman himself trained him to fight back criminals. Barbara Gordon, the daughter of Police Commissioner James Gordon also joined Batman's crusade to become the Batoirl and helps him in his struggle until 'JOKER' a villianous character in Batman Franchise, shot her through the spine after which her both legs were paralysed. Subsequently, she adopted the identity of Oracle and assists Batman technically using her great knowledge in computer science.

The sole presence of Batman attracts the most lunatic and insane villians to Gothman. Batman faces a variety of villians including gangsters, terrorist and the most nerve racking characters. The most impactful of them being the Joker. He is perhaps the most psychotic, delusional and paranoid evil character in Gotham. He, everytime, finds out a new tantrum to terrorise Gotham. Other villans include Carmine Falcone the local Crime Lord, Catwoman, Bane, Two-Face, Mister Freeze and Penguin.





पुराना सब कुछ नया न रहा नया भी रहा न एक समान। प्रगति के साथ बदलते गए, चिरन्तन जीवन के प्रतिमान।।

संचारक्रांति इक्कीसवीं सदी का समर्थतम रूप है। आज कम्प्यूटर, इन्टरनेट, सेटेलाइट आदि संचार के उत्कृष्ट माध्यम हैं। इसमें संदेह नहीं जो माषा इन संचार माध्यमों पर खरी उतरेगी, वह विश्व व्यापार और प्रबन्धन पर अपना आधिपत्य स्थापित करेगी, जिसमें तद्भाषा—भाषी राष्ट्र को रोजगार के 'नए—नए' अवसर उपलब्ध होंगे तथा विश्व में उसकी आर्थिक, सामाजिक तथा प्रौद्योगिक समृद्धता को सुनिश्चित करेंगे।



आज यह सर्वविदित है कि भाषा के रूप में अंग्रेजी उक्त निष्कर्षों पर खरी उत्तर रही है, जिससे अंग्रेजी भाषा—गाषी समुदाय रोजगार के सभी अवसरों से लामान्वित हो रहा है। ऐसे में हिन्दी भाषा तथा भाषियों का अस्तित्व संकट में है। किसी की समृद्धि द्वेष नहीं प्रेरणा का कारण बननी चाहिए, हमें इस भाव से अंग्रेजी को सीखना है, उसके समानान्तर चलना है और अपने लक्ष्य को प्राप्त करना है। आज यदि हिन्दी को संचार प्रौद्योगिकी के

अनुरूप न निखारा गया तो हिन्दी भाषा की पहचान मात्र साहित्यिक कविता, कहानी तक सिमट कर रह जाएगी। फलतः दिनोदिन होते प्रौद्योगिक और वाणिज्यिक विकास का प्रयोजन हिन्दी भाषा—भाषियों के लिए अर्थहीन हो जाएगा, रोजगार के नए अवसर समाप्त हो जाएंगे और जमीनी विकास की संमावनाएँ सीण होती जाएँगी। अस्तु, हिन्दी को विश्वस्तर पर प्रतिष्ठित करने के लिए संचार और प्रौद्योगिकी क्रांति में हिन्दी भाषा को शामिल करना आवश्यक है। यह सच है कि आज की इस पूँजीवादी तथा साम्राज्यवादी व्यवस्था में अंग्रेजी का वर्चस्व है किंतु इस आशंकित भय से कि हम अपनी भाषा की क्षमताओं और संमावनाओं की खेखा कर दें, यह किसी भी दृष्टि से एक स्वाधीन और संप्रमु राष्ट्र के जीवन्त समाज के लिए उपयुक्त नहीं कहा जाएगा। इसके लिए जहाँ शासन—प्रशासन को अपने संकल्पों की पूर्ति के लिए दृढ़ता और धैर्य के साथ निर्णय लेकर उन निर्णयों को कार्यान्वित करना पढ़ेगा, वहीं हिन्दी जनमानस को भी आगे बढ़कर अपनी भाषा के शक्ति—संवर्धन में योगदान करना



पड़ेगा। इसके अतिरिक्त अन्य जितने घटक हैं उनको अपने दायित्वों का निर्वहन करना पड़ेगा तभी हम हिन्दी को सच्चे अर्थों में संचार क्रांति के इस युग में संचार—भाषा का रूप देकर राष्ट्रीय तथा अंतरराष्ट्रीय धरातल पर प्रतिष्ठित करते हुए एक सम्पन्न वैश्विक भाषा का स्थान दिला सकेंगे।

इस मानसिक उत्पीड़न के अनेक कारण हैं और उसमें प्रमुख हैं उनके माता—पिता और उनकी सोच में अन्तर।

पीढ़ी दर पीढ़ी विचार बदलते हैं। समय के साथ—साथ जीवन शैली परिणत होती है और मानसिक तौर पर मानव का विकास होता है। हमारी सोच और जीवन शैली में अन्तर ही तनाव का मुख्य कारण है। हमारे जन्मदाता हमें हर बुराई से दूर रखने की चेष्टा करते हैं। परन्तु आज के युवाओं को यह बन्धन पसंद नहीं। अपने अमिमावकों का खात्मक तरीका उन्हें घुटन और बन्धन के अलावा कुछ नहीं लगता। कारणवश, आज हर घर में पीढ़ी की लड़ाई है, मूल्यों और सिद्धान्तों की जंग है संस्कारों के सांचे में ढ़लने का संग्राम है। इसी कुरूबेत्र में उत्पन्न होता है तनाव।

आज का युवा अपने कंथों पर परिवार की आशाओं और उम्मीदों को ढोता है। अतः उन आशाओं पर खरा उतरना न केवल उसका स्वप्न होता है अपितु उसका कर्तव्य भी होता है। परन्तु जब वह कठिन परिश्रम करने के बाद भी असफल हो जाता है तो उसे निन्दा, उपेक्षा और दुर्व्यवहार का सामना करना पड़ता है। युवाओं का यह कर्तव्य होना चाहिए कि वह पूर्ण परिश्रम कर अपने लक्ष्य की ओर बढ़े और यदि कुछ हाथ न लगे तो मायूस होने के बजाय उस दिशा की ओर फिर सम्पूर्ण प्रयास करें। अपने जीवन की हर विपत्ति का सामना आत्मविश्वास से करें। तभी वह इस तनाव प्रस्त जीवन से मुक्ति पा सकते हैं।

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विकिपीडिया इंटरनेट आधारित एक निःशुल्क ज्ञानकोष परियोजना है। यह एक ऐसे ज्ञान पृष्ठ के रूप में है जो सभी को इसका संपादन करने की छूट देता है। यह एक बहुमाषीय विकल्प है, और स्वयंसेवकों के सहयोग से निर्मित है। जिसकी भी इंटरनेट तक पहुँच है वह विकिपीडिया पर लिख सकता है और लेखों का संपादन कर सकता है। विकिपीडिया के मुख्य सर्वर टैम्पा, फ्लोरिडा में है और अतिरिक्त सर्वर एम्सटर्डेम एवं सियोल में है। निपुण लोगों द्वारा बनाए गए ज्ञानकोष

न्यूपीढिया के रूप में 21 जनवरी, 2001 में इसकी शुरूआत हुई। अब यह विकिपीढिया फाउन्डेशन द्वारा संचालित है जो एक गैर-लामकारी संस्था है। यह 300 से भी ज्यादा मावाओं में है, जिसमें से 15 भाषाओं में 50 हज़ार से भी अधिक लेख है।

विकिपीडिया के संस्थापक जिमी वेल्स के शब्दों में यह 'विश्व के प्रत्येक व्यक्ति के लिए, उनके अपनी माथा में एक बहुमाबीय, मुफ्त, सबसे अधिक गुणवत्ता वाला विश्वकोष बनाने और वितरित करने का एक प्रयत्न है।"

विकिपीडिया के आज के युग में कई लाम है :

- विकि स्वरूप के कारण लेखों की कड़ियों को शब्दों के साथ जोड़ना आसान है, इससे न केवल लेख के बारे में जानकारी मिलती है, बल्कि उससे जुड़ी अन्य रोचक जानकारियाँ भी प्राप्त होती हैं।
- विकिपीडिया में काफी तेज़ी से समसामियक विषयों के बारे में लेखों का विकास हो सकता है।
- गुगल और अन्य सर्च पर किसी विषय पर खोज करने पर विकिपीडिया के लेख परिणामों में प्रमुखता में उमरते हैं।
- 4. विकिपीढिया एक ऐसा मंच है जो शिकायत का मौका नहीं देता है बिल्क आपको अपनी ही शिकायतें दूर करने का मौका देता है। अगर आपको लगता है कि कोई जानकारी अधूरी है या गलत है, तो आप तुरंत उसमें घटजोड़ या सुधार कर सकते हैं। इन समी लामों के बावजूद विकिपीडिया की विश्वसनीयता एवं सत्यता पर भी विवाद होता रहा है। इस वेबसाईट पर आसानी तथा बर्बरता के साथ संपादन करने की क्षमता, असमान गुणवत्ता और कई माषाओं में तथ्य के परोक्ष लोकप्रियता की प्राथमिकता इत्यादि की काफी आलोचनाएँ हुई हैं। फिर भी इसके मुफ्त वितरण, निरंतर और बड़ी संख्या में बदलाव, विभिन्न क्षेत्रों और भाषाओं के समावेश ने इसे इंटरनेट पर विश्व के सबसे अि कि लोकप्रिय निर्देशिका संसाधनों में से एक बना दिया है।
