

From the Principal's Desk












Thanks also to the student council, for standing with me through thick and thin. I wish all my successors "Best of luck! God bless."



From volleyball we now shifted to basketball. Though we lost the final and came second in the shield it wasn't a disappointment as coming second was also a big achievement for this inexperienced team.

Cricket was the first event of the year out of the seven events till now, where we did not secure a position in the first two place.

Following cricket was the inter house Marathon which requires a lot of stamina and energy to prevail. Abhijeet, Bazil, Abraham, Akshat and Paurush secured positions in the top 10 but that wasn't enough for us to win the shield and therefore we had to be satisfied with the second spot.

After so many sporting events in the scorching sun we now moved towards some swimming. 'Disastrous', indeed is the only word to describe our position in the house swimming championship. 
This year on 25th November 2016, we were adjudged as the winners of March Past Shield which added upto 3 shields. This was certainly the best way to end the year as the House Captain.







उत्तर — स्वभावतः मैं बहुत भावुक स्वभाव की हूँ। मैं समझती हूँ कि मेरे स्वभाव में भावुकता क्रोध, प्रेम, सहानुभूति आदि गुणों का मिश्रण है परन्तु ये सब गुण मुझे और भावुक बना देते हैं जब मैं किसी को बहुत दुखी देखती हूँ। ऐसे दुखद क्षणों में मेरा प्रार्थनामय जीवन ही मुझे अत्यन्त संयमी और शान्त बना देता है। मैं अपना सारा बोझ ईश्वर पर डाल देती हूँ। मैं हर मुनष्य में ईश्वर का स्वरूप ही देखती हूँ।

प्रश्न - विद्यार्थियों के विकास में आपकी क्या राय है ?

उत्तर – हमारा उददेश्य बच्चों को पूर्णतः शिक्षित कर उनके अन्दर के गुणों को विकसित करना है। उनको एक



शिक्षित नागरिक बनाना है जो समाज में मर्यादित तथा सुखमय जीवन बिता सके। आजकल के बच्चों का बचपन हमारी मीडिया ने छीन लिया है। बचपन जो बहुत मासूम हुआ करता था आज दूरदर्शन के अश्लील धारावाहिकों में समाप्त हो चुका है। ऐसे वातावरण में उन्हें सही राह दिखाना हमारा कर्तव्य और परम धर्म बन चुका है।

प्रश्न – आपके अनुसार शिक्षणेतर क्रियाओं का विद्यार्थी के जीवन में क्या महत्व है ?

उत्तर – शिक्षणेतर क्रियायें जीवन को सुधारने में बहुत महत्व रखती हैं। बच्चों का जीवन कोमल है और बहुत ऊर्जा से परिपूर्ण है। जीवन को प्रोत्साहित करने के लिए यह सही समय होता है। बच्चों को विभिन्न क्रियाओं में भाग लेने से प्रोत्साहन मिलता है। हार और जीत जीवन के मुख्य अंग हैं। अतः उनके आगे बढ़ने का उपयुक्त समय यही है। हमारा विद्यालय इस क्षेत्र में बहुत आगे है।

प्रश्न – आपके अनुसार क्या कोई अन्य शिक्षणेतर क्रियाओं को हमारे विद्यालय में जोड़ना चाहिए ?

उत्तर – मेरे अनुसार जो भी क्रिया कलाप है, वे पर्याप्त है। बच्चों को प्रोत्साहित करने में जितना आवश्यक है उतना ही देना है। इस लिए किसी भी नये क्रिया कलापों को जोड़ने की आवश्यकता नहीं है। हर क्रिया का शैक्षिक आधार होना चाहिए।

प्रश्न - बच्चों को सर्वाड् गीण विकास हेतु क्या-क्या प्रयास किए जाते हैं ?

उत्तर — सर्वाड् गीण विकास हर तरह से बहुत जरुरी है। इसिलए उनको प्रोत्साहित करने के लिए हम अपनी पूरी कोशिश करते हैं। हमारे पास समय का अभाव है। हम समय का पूर्ण सदुपयोग करके उन्हें अच्छा नागरिक बनाकर समाज में तैयार कर सकें। शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में हमारा सहयोग सदैव सराहनीय है। आडियों—विजुअल तथा कक्षा शिक्षण मिल कर बच्चों को जिज्ञासु बना देती है।

प्रश्न - हम दोनों सम्पादकों के बारे में आपके क्या विचार है ?

उत्तर – सारे काम लगन और मेहनत से पूरे करते हो। विद्यालय के प्रति कर्तव्यनिष्ठता और उत्साह का भाव सराहनीय है।

प्रश्न – अनुशासन के प्रति आपके विचार क्या हैं ?

उत्तर — अनुशासन हमारे जीवन की दिनचर्या को सम्भालने में बहुत महत्वपूर्ण है। आज के वर्तमान काल में अनुशासन हीन बच्चों को अनुशासित करना एक समस्या का विषय है लेकिन उनको प्रेम से सुधारा जा सकता है। उनके जीवन में जिस चीज़ की कमी है, उन भावनाओं में प्रेम का समावेश करके उसको काफी हद तक अनुशासित करने की कोशिश करते हैं। इसके लिए हमें काऊन्सलर की भी जरूरत पड़ती है जो हमारे कॉलेज में हर समय उपलब्ध है।

प्रश्न - आपके जीवन का सिद्धान्त ?

उत्तर — मैं अपने को बहुत सिद्धान्तवादी तो नहीं कह सकती हूँ लेकिन न्याय, सच्चाई और प्रेम मय और प्रार्थनामय जीवन बिताना ही मेरे जीवन का सिद्धान्त है। बच्चों तथा अभिभावकों का पथ प्रदर्शन ही मेरे जीवन का एकमात्र लक्ष्य है। मैं कालेज के हर बच्चे को ईश्वर का दिया हुआ वरदान समझती हूँ और ईश्वर का रूप मैं इन बच्चों में देखती हूँ। □

हिन्दी साहित्य और देशप्रेम



स्वतन्त्रता आंदोलन के दौरान हिन्दी—साहित्य में देशभक्ति के गीतों की एक समानान्तर धारा विकसित हुई थी। इस जन—जागरण काल के साहित्य में सोए हुए शेरों को जगाने में समर्थ वीर—रस की कविता की भरमार थी।

जयशंकर प्रसाद ने मातृभूमि के प्रति गौरव भाव जाग्रत करने के उद्देश्य से ये कालजयी पंक्तियाँ लिखी थी —

"हिमाद्रि तुंग से प्रबुद्ध शुद्ध भारती। स्वयं प्रभा समुज्ज्वला स्वतंत्रता पुकारती।।"

सोहन लाल द्विवेदी मुख्य रुप से देशप्रेम के ही गीतकार थे। उनका यह गीत शिक्षित आंदोलन–कारियों में विशेष रुप से लोकप्रिय था–

"वंदना के इन स्वरों में एक स्वर मेरा मिला। हो जहाँ बिल शीश अगणित एक सर मेरा मिला लो।।"

जनजागरण काल के सबसे प्रमुख कवि हुए माखनलाल चतुर्वेदी। उनकी इन पंक्तियों में राष्ट्रीय एकता की शक्ति, मातृ भूमि का गौरव मुखरित हो उठा है —

उनकी ''पुष्प की अभिलाषा'' शीर्षक से लिखी गई ये पंक्तियाँ तो आज भी बच्चे—बच्चे की जुबान पर है— ''मुझे तोड़ लेना वनमाली उस पथ पर देना तुम फेंक। मातृभूमि पर शीश—चढ़ाने जिस पथ जाएँ वीर अनेक।।''

कविगुरु रवीन्द्रनाथ टैगोर के "जन गण मन" को राष्ट्रगान एंव बंकिम चन्द्र के "वंदेमातरम्" को राष्ट्रगीत होने का सम्मान प्राप्त है। जगदम्बा प्रसाद मिश्र "हितैषी" का यह शेर किसने नहीं सुना होगा —

"शहीदों की चिताओं पर लगेगें हर बरस मेले। वतन पर मरने वालों का यही बाकी निशां होगा।।"

श्याम लाल गुप्त "पार्षद" का "झंडा ऊँचा रहे हमारा तथा ठाकुर राम सिंह (आजाद हिंद फौज) का "वतन की राह में वतन के नौजवाँ शहीद हो" भी अत्यन्त लोकप्रीय गीत रहे हैं। नेताजी के आजाद हिंद फौज ने अपने समर अभियान के दौरान जहाँ "दिल्ली चलो" और "तुम मुझे खून दो, मैं तुम्हें आज़ादी दूँगा" जैसे अमर नारे दिए, वहीं कई अमर देश भिक्त—गीतों को भी जन्म दिया—

"कदम कदम बढ़ाए जा, खुशी के गीत गाए जा। ये जिंदगी है कौम की तू कौम पे लुटाए जा।।"

इकबाल का यह गीत तो कयामत तक भारत में गाया जाता रहेगा-

''सारे जहाँ से अच्छा हिन्दोस्ताँ हमारा, हम बुलबुले हैं इसके, ये गुलिस्ताँ हमारा।''

स्थापित कवियों के अतिरिक्त उस काल में कई आंदोलनकारियों एवं देशभक्त क्रांतिकारियों ने भी अपनी उत्कट भावनाओं को छन्द में उतार कर अपना क्रांतिगीत गढ़ा था। राम प्रसाद "बिरिमल" का यह गीत एक अच्छा उदाहरण है—

"सरफरोशी की तमन्ना अब हमारे दिल में हैं। देखना है जोर कितना बाजु-ए-कातिल में है।।"

भगत सिंह अपनी मंडली के साथ फाँसी के तख्ते पर चढ़ते समय तक यह गीत गा रहे थे-



"मेरा रंग दे बसंती चोला"

ये सारे गीत स्वतंत्रता आंदोलन में बिगुल की तरह बजे थे। आज भी हर स्वतंत्रता दिवस, गणतंत्र दिवस आदि राष्ट्रीय त्योहारों के अवसर पर गली-गली में यह गीत गाए जाते हैं। देश पर जब भी कोई संकट आता है, ये गीत हमारे सम्बल बनते हैं, हमारे हृदय में स्वदेश-प्रेम हिलारें लेने लगता है।



मातृभाषा हिन्दी

भारत एक विशाल देश है। अनेक भाषाएँ हैं यहाँ, लेकिन देश के हर व्यक्ति के लिए हर भाषा सीखना सम्भव नहीं हो सकता। तब देश की एकता और अखण्डता को ध्यान में रखते हुए एक ऐसी भाषा की आवश्यकता इस देश के मनीषियों ने अनुभव की जिसमें सब देशवासी परस्पर, सम्प्रेषण कर सकें। उन्होंने अनेक विशेषताओं के कारण हिन्दी को इस पद पर प्रतिष्ठित किया। स्वयं हिन्दी की ओर से किसी ने कभी भी ऐसा दावा पेश नहीं किया। दूसरी मातृभाषाओं ने स्वयं इसका वरण किया था।



मातृभाषा की महत्ता जितनी निर्विवाद है, उतनी ही निर्विवाद है राष्ट्रभाषा या राजभाषा की महत्ता। अनादि काल से इस देश के मनीषियों ने, चाहे वे उत्तर के रहे हो या दक्षिण के, पूर्व के वासी हों या पश्चिम के, एक अखण्ड देश की कल्पना की है और उस कल्पना को रचनात्मक रूप देने का प्रयत्न भी किया है। उसी प्रक्रिया में उन्होंने अनुभव की राष्ट्रभाषा की अनिवार्यता। जगत् गुरु शंकराचार्य का जन्म सुंदर समुद्रतटवर्ती केरल में हुआ था। लेकिन उन्होंने स्वप्न देखा भारत की एक रूपता का। उस एकरूपता को रूपायित करने के लिए उन्होंने सबसे पहले संस्कृत का अध्ययन किया और फिर सारे देश को शास्त्रार्थ में जीतकर चारों कोनों पर चार मठ स्थापित कर दिए।

उस समय जो काम संस्कृत के द्वारा सम्भव हो सका था, वही आज हिन्दी के द्वारा हो सकता है, इस तथ्य को देश के मनीषियों ने, भले ही उनकी मातृभाषा कुछ भी रही हो, जान लिया था और उसको चरितार्थ करने के लिए सच्चे मन से प्रयत्न भी किया था।

एक और सत्य हमें जान लेना आवश्यक है। भाषा संस्कृति से जुड़ी है। वह व्यक्ति के मनोभावों का सम्प्रेषण ही नहीं करती, बल्कि उसके समाज और देश की संस्कृति को भी उजागर करती है। इसीलिए, भाषा को संस्कृति की वाहिका कहा गया है। यह काम किसी ऐसी भाषा के द्वारा सम्भव है जिसकी जड़े देश की मिट्टी में हो, क्योंकि संस्कृति का सम्बन्ध देश की भूमि से अर्थात् भूगोल से भी होता है, बल्कि उसी से अधिक होता है। जिस भाषा की जड़े देश की मिट्टी में नहीं हैं, वह देश को जोड़ने का काम कभी नहीं कर सकती।

न्यायमूर्ति शरदचरण मित्र ने कहा था – "हिन्दी समस्त आर्यावर्त की भाषा है। यद्यपि मैं बंगाली हूँ, तथापि इस वृद्धावस्था में मेरे लिए वह गौरव का दिन होगा, जिस दिन सारे भारतवासियों के साथ हिन्दी में वार्तालाप करूँगा।"

मातृ भाषा हिन्दी की महत्ता प्रतिपादित करते हुए भारतेन्दु हरिश्चन्द्र ने लिखा -

निज भाषा उन्नति अहै, सब उन्नति को मूल। बिनु निज भाषा ज्ञान के, मिटै न हिय को सूल।। 🗖



एक ही दिवस पर दो विभूतियों ने भारत माता को गौरान्वित किया। गाँधीजी एवं लाल बहादुर शास्त्रीजी का जन्म 2 अक्टूबर हुआ था। गाँधी जी ने सत्य, अहिंसा के बल पर अंग्रेजों से भारत को स्वतंत्र कराकर हम सभी को स्वतंत्र भारत का अनमोल उपहार दिया। राष्ट्र ने उन्हें 'राष्ट्रपिता' का सम्मान दिया। वहीं "जय जवान, जय किसान" का "नारा" महापुरूष लाल बहादुर शास्त्री जी ने दिया, जो स्वतंत्र भारत के दूसरे प्रधानमंत्री बने।

राष्ट्रिपिता महात्मा गाँधी सिर्फ भारत के ही हीरो नहीं है बल्कि डाक टिकटों के मामले में वह विश्व के 104 देशों में सबसे बड़े हीरो हैं। विश्व में अकेले गांधीजी ही ऐसे ही लोकप्रिय नेता है जिन पर अधिक डाक टिकट जारी होना एक रिकार्ड है। यहाँ तक कि आजाद भारत में वे

प्रथम व्यक्ति थे, जिन पर डाक टिकट जारी हुआ किन्तु दिलचस्प बात यह थीं कि जिंदगी भर 'स्वेदशी' को महत्व देने वाले गांधी जी को सम्मानित करने के लिए जारी किए गए पहले डाक टिकट की छपाई विदेश में ही हुई थी।

रोचक बात तो यह है कि आजादी के बाद ब्रिटेन ने अपने देश में पहला टिकट गाँधी जी का ही निकाला था। इससे पहले ब्रिटेन में राजा-रानी के ही टिकट छापे जाते थे।



राष्ट्रपिता पर सर्वाधिक डाक-टिकट उनके जन्म शताब्दी वर्ष 1969 में जारी हुए थे। उस वर्ष विश्व के 35 देशों ने उन पर 70 से अधिक डाक टिकट जारी किये।

गाँधीजी ने जिस प्रकार सत्य, अहिंसा, शान्ति के रास्तों पर चलते हुए अंग्रेजों को भारत छोड़ने पर मजबूर किया, उसका कोई दूसरा उदाहरण विश्व इतिहास में देखने को नहीं मिलता। तभी तो विख्यात वैज्ञानिक आंइस्टीन ने कहा था कि हजार साल बाद आने वाली नस्लें इस बात पर मुश्किल से विश्वास करेगी कि हाड—मांस से बना ऐसा कोई इंसान धरती पर कभी आया था।"
